

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Presenter Profiles:

Independent Chairs

<u>Paul Burnett – Independent Chair, Leicestershire and Rutland Safeguarding Adults Board and</u> Safeguarding Children Board

Paul Burnett is Director of Paul Burnett Associates Ltd, a company providing interim management, consultancy and project management services to local government and other organisations in the field of Children's Services.

He is currently Independent Chair of the Safeguarding Children Board in Leicestershire and Rutland and chairs the Safeguarding Adults Boards in Leicestershire and Rutland. He also works as an Inclusion Quality Mark Assessor in schools.

Paul Burnett was Corporate Director for Children and Young People in Northamptonshire County Council from 2007 until 2011.

He began his career as a secondary school teacher in Northamptonshire, holding a variety of roles including pastoral, staff development and special educational needs support posts. His local government career began with East Sussex County Council, where he held a variety of posts covering in-service training, special educational needs, resources, strategic planning and support services as well as spending a period in the Executive Office. From 1997, he was Assistant Director in the new unitary authority in Brighton and Hove. Initially responsible for Parent and Pupil Services, he took a lead role in the strategic planning for Children's Services and the creation of the Children, Families and Schools directorate that drew together education and Children's Social Services. Between 2003 and 2007 he worked in the London Borough of Greenwich, first as Director of Education and subsequently as Director of Children's Services.

Dr David Jones- Independent Chair of the Leicester Safeguarding Children Board.

David N Jones was appointed in 2010 as the Independent Chair of the Leicester Children (LSCB) and Adult (LSAB) Safeguarding Boards. He was reappointed for a second 3 year term in 2013. He is an experienced Chair having held a range of national and international roles during a varied 40 year career, which has focused on social work, children's services, multi-professional practice and workforce policy. He qualified as a social worker in 1974 and was formerly a Deputy Director in the Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (Ofsted). He was recently awarded a visiting international scholarship at Monmouth University, USA.

David has helped lead strategic and operational change in social work and children's services for many years, including operational oversight of the Ofsted 'unannounced inspections' of initial assessment in children's services. He has substantial experience of national and international governing boards as chair, member and officer, working with Parliament, Minsters and government officials. He has contributed to the development and review of national child care and social services policy since 1975 and was a government adviser on the implementation of the Every Child Matters: Change for Children programme. David has worked internationally as Chair, Adviser and Consultant to several groups, policy committees, advisory boards and councils, including the Council of Europe. He retired after 4 years as honorary President of the International Federation of Social Workers in 2010 and is the IFSW global coordinator of the Global Agenda for Social Work and Social Development process.





Learning the lessons from Serious Case Reviews: Chris Nerini.

Chris Nerini is the Head of Strategy for Safeguarding Assurance at Leicestershire County Council, Children and Family Services and has been in this post for five years. She qualified as a Social Worker in 1983 and has worked as a senior manager in a number of East Midlands Authorities. Chris is Chair of the LR Serious Case Review Subgroup. She holds an MA in Social Work had has a Master's in Business Administration (MBA).

Adrian Spanswick. Consultant/Designated Nurse Safeguarding (Children and Adult Safeguarding)

Adrian qualified as a Register General Nurse in 1987 and as a Registered Health Visitor in 1992 and completed both his nursing and health visitor training in Leicester.

As a health visitor he worked in Rugby (East Warwickshire) and Leicester City. While working as a health visitor in Leicester City he completed Masters in Child Care Law and Practice at Keele University. In 1999 he was appointed as Child Protection Nurse Specialist (Named Nurse) for Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland health provider (services included community health, community hospitals, minor injury units, adult and children's mental health services and learning disabilities. Appointed Designated Nurse Child Protection (2003: Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland) and Nurse Consultant Safeguarding Children (2004 – retaining Designated responsibilities).

Adrian manages the Hosted CCG Safeguarding team. He has Designated Nurse responsibilities for Leicester City and is a member of both Children and Adult Boards. He is Chair of the Children Serious Case Review Sub-Group. As part of role in the CCG he is the Designated Adult Safeguarding Manager (DASM) – includes lead for the MCA.

Neglect:

Rama Ramakrishnan.

Rama completed her master's degree in social work at Mumbai university in India in 1981. She undertook work in India following this working with children in deprived slum communities focussing on education and enabling children to achieve their potential in very difficult circumstances.

From 1986 she worked with two local authorities, social services departments in Hertfordshire and Northampton within their children and families teams.

She joined the NSPCC in 1998 initially as a children services manager then as a service manager managing services that focus on early intervention and prevention in areas where neglect, parental mental health issues, substance misuse and domestic abuse are prevalent. She is currently in this post.

Julie Quincey.

Julie is one of the Designated Nurses for Safeguarding Children and Adults within the Hosted Safeguarding Team covering the three CCGs. Prior to this she was the Named Nurse for four years at Northampton General Hospital and led a team of safeguarding nurses. Clinically Julie worked in Specialist CAMHS in Kettering as the Lead Primary Mental Health Worker and later as service manager for ten years. Prior to this Julie worked as Health Visitor in a number of deprived estates. Julie has designed the LLR neglect toolkit the aim of the toolkit is to give practitioners an objective assessment to outline concerns within





families where neglect may be a feature. Julie is a Registered Nurse and Health Visitor and holds a degree in Child Mental Health Nursing.

Voice of the Practitioner:

Janice Brien.

I qualified as a social worker in 2000 and have worked in Birmingham, Nottingham and Derby I have worked for Leicester City Council in the Safeguarding and Quality Assurance Unit for the last 12 years.

My role is to chair at risk meetings for children and young people and to undertake a quality assurance role, with regard to policy and procedures being adhered to and practice issues. I chair Child in Need meetings if there is a step down from a Child Protection plans, I chair meetings for young people who may be at risk of sexual exploitation and Child Protection Conferences. The team also covers the LADO role and children using sexually harmful behaviours (CUSAB meetings).

Within the team I am responsible for managing the diary for team meetings, guest speakers, agenda items etc. I am also responsible for compiling the duty rota so that there is a Chair available to advise/problem solve and scrutinise requests for meetings prior to them being booked in the main diary.

Until 2.5 years ago I also chaired meetings for Looked After Children as an IRO.

In the 12 years I have worked for Leicester, I have not known a more difficult climate than the current one. I remain committed to safeguarding and striving to achieve positive outcomes for children.

Managing Allegations against Professionals: Role of the Local Authority Designated Officers (LADO):

Stephen Tee. (Leicester City)

I qualified as a Social Worker in 2003, having previously worked with children since 1999. My previous experienced includes working as Social Worker, Senior Practitioner and Team Manager. I started in Leicester Safeguarding Unit in Sept 2011. I have been the Interim LADO since Sept 2015.

Mark Goddard. (Leicestershire.)

I graduated from Trent Polytechnic in Nottingham in 1991.

I worked with drug and alcohol services for three years before coming to Leicestershire Social Services in 1994, joining a well-established Child Protection Team as a Social Worker.

In 2001 I joined the Safeguarding Team as an Independent Reviewing Officer and in 2012 I became the LADO for Leicestershire.

Elaine Newcombe. (Rutland)

Elaine started her work in Social Care as a Children's Social Work assistant and moved into management roles in Adult Social Care. Elaine then moved across to Children's services in 1998 and has been a manager for 15 years. Elaine previously has worked as a Nurse and Police Officer.





Vulnerability and risks to babies

<u>Dr Sudhir Sethi MD FRCPCH MPH. (Consultant Paediatrician Designated Dr for Child Protection - Leicester, Leicestershire & Rutland)</u>

Dr Sudhir Sethi has been a Consultant Paediatrician for the last 16 years and Designated Doctor for Child Protection for Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland since 2001.

His current role also includes supporting community paediatric services within Leicestershire Partnership NHS Trust (LPT), with weekly clinics in Melton Hospital and Wigston. He remains actively involved in Serious Case Review (SCR) work and Executive Committees for both the LSCBs.

He is the regional lead for the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health for Child Protection.

Jan Harrison RGN B.A. Hons (Designated Nurse Safeguarding Children and Adults.)

Jan is a Designated Nurse for Children and Adults Safeguarding. She is Chair of the Leicestershire and Rutland LSCB/SAB Safeguarding Effectiveness Group, a member of the Leicestershire and Rutland Local Safeguarding Children Board and Vice Chair of the Leicester City LSCB Safeguarding Effectiveness Group. Jan has supported several Child Serious Case Reviews and Domestic Homicide Reviews as the Designated Nurse Panel Member.

Jan's professional background has maintained a strong safeguarding focus in both operational and strategic roles. She worked for 11 years in Leicestershire as a Health Visitor and HV Community Practice Teacher with an extended role of Domestic Violence Lead. This was followed by seven years' experience working in Nottingham City as the Children Centres Public Health Lead, and then as Locality Manager for Health Visiting and School Nursing.

Returning to Leicester in 2009, Jan worked as Designated Nurse Looked After Children prior to undertaking her current role in 2013.
