Thresholds Guidance

The LSCB Guidance on **threshold criteria** for children's and family services in Leicester City is intended to assist professionals within the Leicester Children's workforce to identify suitable responses to needs and issues that they encounter amongst the children, young people and families they are working with. The document brings together, for the first time, the threshold criteria across Leicester City, Leicestershire and Rutland County Councils, under the responsibilities of the Leicester Safeguarding Children Board and the Leicestershire and Rutland Safeguarding Children Board. Child advocacy center based group treatment for child sexual abuse.

Examines the social validity of a group treatment programme for children who have been sexually abused, delivered at a child advocacy centre.

Reports on a study which explored the social relationships of children who had been sexually abused. It used both self-reports and teachers' assessments to compare 93 victims of child sexual abuse with 75 non-victims of a similar age.
