In addition, and in line with multi-agency safeguarding arrangements, the **audit group** is to undertake audits in preparation for national JTAI themes as they are announced.

Safeguarding partners will receive updates and assurance on the local transformation activity for Family Help, multiagency child protection, and Family Group Decision Making. The **policy and procedures group** will lead on publishing a refreshed threshold document by the end of the transformation year (March 2026) confirming changes and setting out a broad continuum of Family Help.
