In addition, and in line with multi-agency safeguarding arrangements, the **audit group** is to undertake audits in preparation for national JTAI themes as they are announced.

Safeguarding partners will receive updates and assurance on the local transformation activity for Family Help, multi-agency child protection, and Family Group Decision Making. The **policy and procedures group** will lead on publishing a refreshed threshold document by the end of the transformation year (March 2026) confirming changes and setting out a broad continuum of Family Help.
